The Proscenium Carmel, IN

Woolpert partnered with a private development firm to design the Proscenium, a \$60 million mixed-use development, in Carmel's growing cultural center. Plans for the development included 225 luxury one- and two-bedroom residential units along with high-end amenities designed to appeal to the lifestyle needs of young professionals. Centered on 1.8 acres of public green space, the Proscenium will host 20,000 square feet of retail and 60,000 square feet of office space. When planning the Proscenium's architectural details, Woolpert architects blended classically proportioned contemporary façades with historical ones to reinforce the existing traditional and neoclassical aesthetics found in Carmel's City Center.



Ellisville Square Ellisville, MO

When a big-box retailer vacated the Ellisville Square neighborhood shopping center, a private development company selected Woolpert to redevelop and revitalize the property. By dividing the existing 86,850-squarefoot anchor store into three smaller retail anchor units, Woolpert created right-sized spaces for a broader pool of retail tenants. Additionally, Woolpert refreshed the aesthetics of the center and outparcels with new, more modern exterior facades and lighting upgrades, and enhanced landscaping and pedestrian walkways.



West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine Student Center *Lewisburg, WV*

Winner of a 2017 *Learning By Design* award, the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine Student Center frames historic parade grounds and features an iconic clock tower. Woolpert designed the 67,000-square-foot facility to pay homage to the college's historic physical location and anchor the surrounding community. The two-story student center includes food preparation and dining spaces, a campus bookstore, technology support spaces, a recreation center and a multimedia conference hall with flexible partitions and seating for 1,000.

DoDEA Barkley Elementary School Replacement Fort Campbell, KY

Barkley Elementary School is one of the first schools to be designed under the Department of Defense Education Activity's (DoDEA) new 21st-century education charter, an initiative seeking to facilitate a wide range of educational and instructional techniques through modern learning environments. The Woolpert-designed school will house 740 students in approximately 142,000 square feet while consuming less than one-third of the energy of comparable buildings. The design team incorporated multiple 21st-century education philosophies, including natural lighting, geothermal HVAC, thermal envelopes and solar water heating. Woolpert provided architecture, interior design, engineering, surveying and construction support services for this award-winning project.
